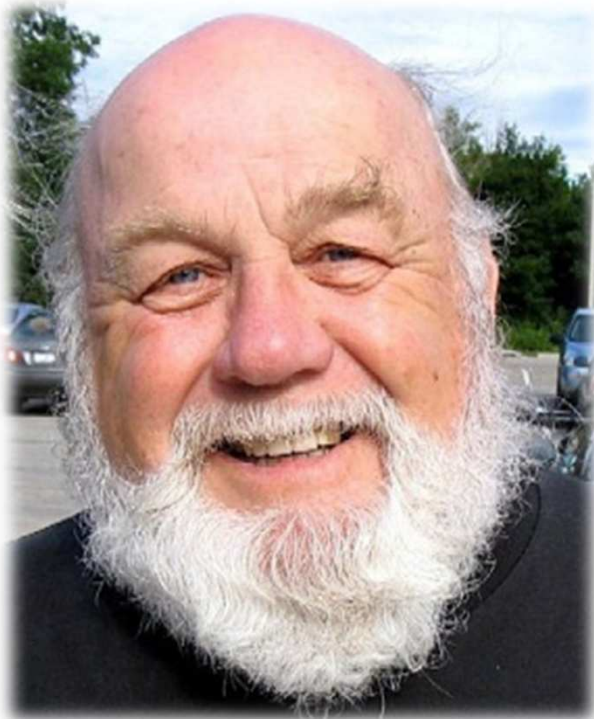

Earl joined our club in 1984 and helped out on different committees and in 1994 was elected Club President, served for one term and in 1996 moved out west. He returned to the club in 2000 and re-established himself as an "A" division player with a 32.3%, since 2011 with various injuries and illness his average has declined, but his club average since 1995 (17 seasons) remains a very respectable 29.6%.

Even after turning 70 in 2006, he has won the World's, Canadian and Ontario doubles championships. Ontario doubles three times with his partner Gary Johnson.

In 2015 after loaning his portable pits for the last 3 years, for the Fall Tournament, he donated them to the club.

This will added to his legacy of his outstanding service and performance, while representing our club over 28 years.
