Moved to Brampton in 1988, in 1993 established and successfully ran his own commercial spray painting business.

Jack enjoyed all sports he had a passion for golf, playing pool, hockey and played in a pickup league and of course horseshoes. When not playing sports, he enjoyed outdoor activities including camping, fishing and snowmobiling.

He joined our club in 2005, started off in the "D" division and finished the year with a 9.2 % average, 2006 - 15.9 %, "C" division 2007 - 16.3 and in his final year 10.7 %, club average 13.0%. In 2006 received the Elwood Pembleton Award for the most improved player.

Jack continued to play right up until the middle of July, when he never had enough strength to throw any more, he stopped pitching, but managed to get out and encourage his team.

Since he joined the club he was a tireless worker and demonstrated that during the building of the two shelters, despite undergoing chemo, he was out there working and sandblasted and painted the top and bottom plates.

Just before his death the executive decided to present him with



an award for his Courage, perseverance and dedication, it was named the Jack Savery - Cecil Churchill Award, he was proud of the award named after him and showed it to everyone that came to visit.

On September 15, 2008 we lost a valued member, and a true friend.

The words on the plaque say it all: You continue to play and share your fellowship while fighting a tough battle with a serious medical condition, a lesser man would have quit. You are an inspiration to all members of the **Brampton Men's Horseshoe Club.**
